

The competition is open to all US residents 18 years of age or older, excluding fotofoto gallery artists. Any photographic medium including digital and alternative processes will be accepted. The maximum **height or width** of framed work cannot exceed **24 inches**. Free-standing pieces cannot be accepted.

SUBMISSIONS

FOR ACCEPTED ENTRIES

Approximately 30 photographs will be chosen for a nearly six-week exhibition January - March 2018. Shipping information will be provided to artists selected for participation upon completion of the jury process. To ensure the cohesiveness of the exhibition, we request that work be framed in simple black or white frames with neutral museum quality mats (no colors please).

While being a champion of artists, she created a thriving artist-in-residence program at RayKo. Besides being a curator, Ann Jastrab is a fine art photographer, master darkroom printer, and teacher. She has been teaching courses in the San Francisco Bay Area and at the Maine Media Workshops (formerly the Maine Photographic Workshops) in Rockport, Maine since 1995.
